Dear Mr. Berentzen:

With this letter, I am forwarding the proposed one-year contract and draft work plan for FY11. As we have previously discussed in meetings with the Local Health Departments, this represents an interim measure while we work together to revamp the Environmental Service Delivery contracting process.

The total funding allotment for Bear River Health Department for FY2011 is \$90,365. This represents:

- A decrease in General Fund base of \$2,707. Due to the economy, the Legislature decreased DEQ's General Fund budget and, given the total General Fund cuts over the past two years, we had little choice but to pass on the decrease.
- Increased UST funding from \$10,200.00 to \$10,410.00. The yearly amount increases or decreases based on proportionate changes in the number of tanks in each district, compared to the total number of tanks in the State.
- Addition of radon funding for outreach purposes. Our radon program contacted each Local Health Department to determine interest in this funding and Bear River expressed its interest.
- A simplifying of the requirement for the Lead and Asbestos funds. (The amount remains the same) The change removes all but the public information requirement. The move eliminates the conflict of interest situation, identified by the Attorney General's Office, existing when LHDs both oversaw and performed inspections. The change allows those who are interested to perform inspections within their jurisdiction and to charge a fee for this service. It also changed the reporting requirement from quarterly to yearly.
- All other funding and requirements remains the same.

Please review these documents. If you are in agreement, please sign and return. If you have concerns, please let Renette Anderson know and she will work to resolve them.
