Dear Mr. Berentzen:

With this letter, I am forwarding the proposed one-year contract and work plan for FY12. As we have previously discussed, this represents an interim measure while we continue to work together to revamp the Environmental Service Delivery contracting process.

The workplans were previously e-mailed to each Local Health Officer and Environmental Director to assure that content was acceptable. We received an e-mail back from Grant Koford that your Department had looked it over and was okay with your workplan. Since then, we made a slight change by simplifying requirements under the "Get the Mercury Out" program and by changing the name of the company with the state disposal contract.

The total funding allotment for Bear River Health Department for FY2011 is \$90,795.00. This represents:

- Decreased UST funding from \$10,410.00 to \$10,240.00. The yearly amount increases or decreases based on proportionate changes in the number of tanks in each district, compared to the total number of tanks in the State.
- Increased radon funding from \$400.00 to \$1,000.00 for outreach purposes. Our radon program contacted each Local Health Department to determine interest in this funding and Bear River expressed its interest.
- All other funding and requirements remains the same.


