Dear Mr. Berentzen:

With this letter, I am forwarding the proposed one-year contract and work plan for FY13. The total funding allotment for Bear River Health Department for FY13 is \$90,345. This represents:

- Slightly increased UST funding from \$10,240 to \$10,290. The yearly amount increases or decreases based on proportionate changes in the number of tanks in each district, compared to the total number of tanks in the State.
- Decreased radon funding from \$1,000 to \$500. As we discussed at the last Local Health Officer Meeting, EPA has indicated that it is cutting the Radon grant funding however, we wanted to continue it in FY13 and then see if we could find a way to fund it in the future.
- All other funding and requirements remains the same.

Funding and adjustments become effective July 1, 2012. Annual reports on current fiscal year work are due by August 31, 2012. As in prior years, an e-mail with the simplified reporting form will be sent out in late July.

Please review these documents and, if you are in agreement, sign and return them. If you have concerns, let Renette Anderson know and she will work with you to resolve them.
