Dear Mr. Berentzen:

With this letter, I am forwarding the proposed one-year contract and work plan for FY15. The total funding allotment for Bear River Health Department for FY15 is \$122,913. This represents:

- Slightly increased UST funding from \$10,280 to \$10,310. The yearly amount increases or decreases based on proportionate changes in the number of tanks in each district, compared to the total number of tanks in the State.
- Increased Drinking Water funding from \$11,310 to \$40,968. Additional monies were made available to the Division by the Legislature. The funding is based on the total amount available for local health activities and is divided amongst the Local Health Departments, based on the number and type of sanitary surveys performed.
- Funding for Radon activities. Bear River's share of the available funds is \$3,000.
- All other funding remains the same.

Funding and adjustments become effective July 1, 2014. As in years past, the funds will be disbursed in quarterly installments beginning on August 1. Annual reports on current fiscal year work are due by August 31, 2014. The reporting form will be sent out in late July.

Please review these documents and, if you are in agreement, sign and return them. The contract this year includes a provision for electronic signatures (see Attachment C), if you prefer.

If you have concerns, let Renette Anderson know and she will work with you to resolve them. Thank you for your continued partnership efforts.
