PUBLIC NOTICE OF RENEWAL OF A UPDES PERMIT

PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO REISSUE A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER QUALITY ACT, SECTION 19-5-104 AND 107, UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO UPDES PERMIT AND THE STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING THE TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303 (d) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA).

BACKGROUND

The Gadsby Plant utilizes water from either the Jordan River, or Salt Lake City Culinary Water. Jordan River water is treated before use in the plant processes. This water is used for a variety of processes and becomes part of the facility waste water. The waste water is directed to two treatment ponds in series which receives water from cooling tower blowdown, boiler blowdown, yard drains, storm water, excess treated raw water and reverse osmosis reject. The permit incorporates storm water provisions.
